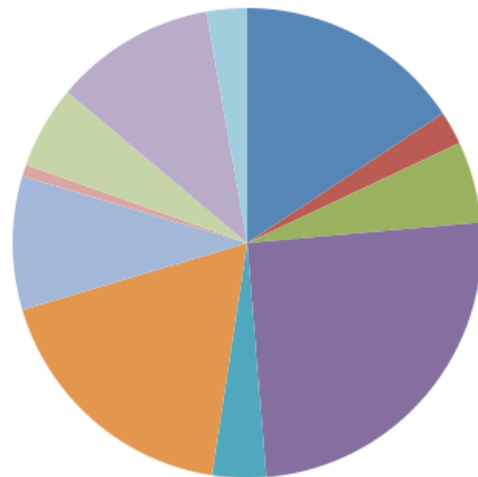
Participants of social inclusion poll

A total of 761 participants with a disability completed the poll. The charts below show the demographic data collected from participants.

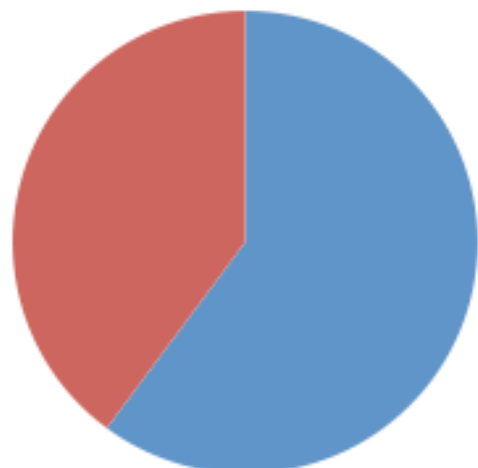

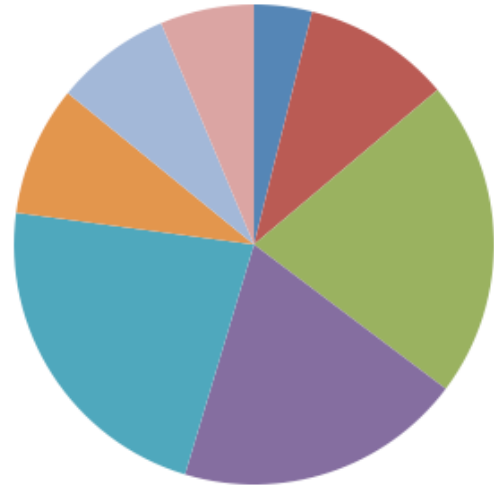

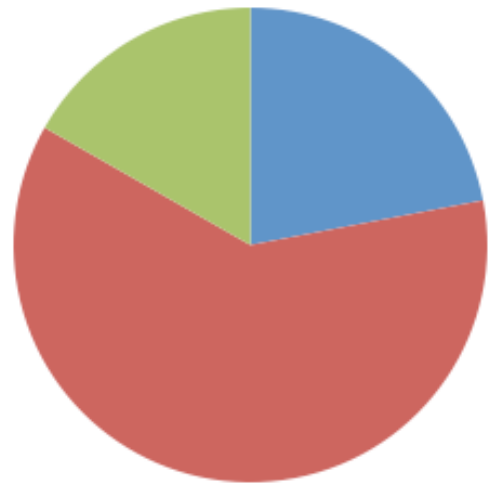

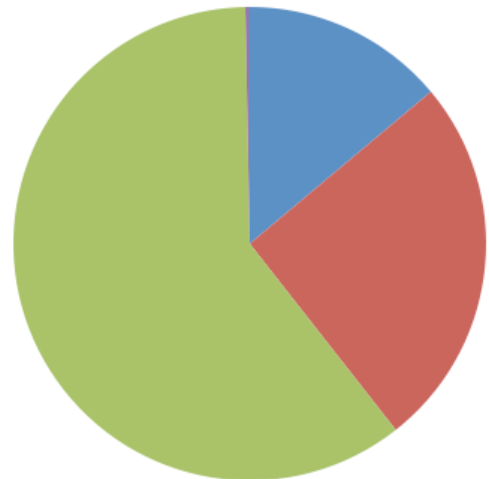

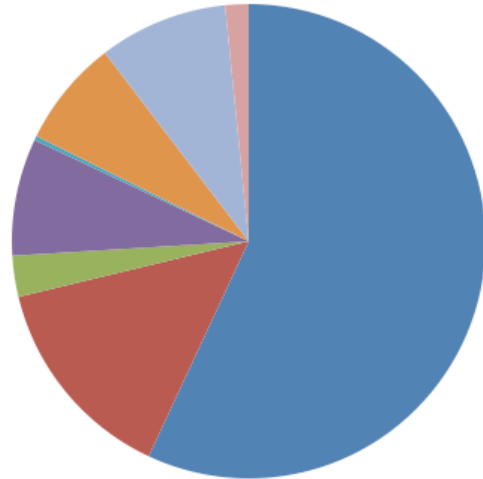

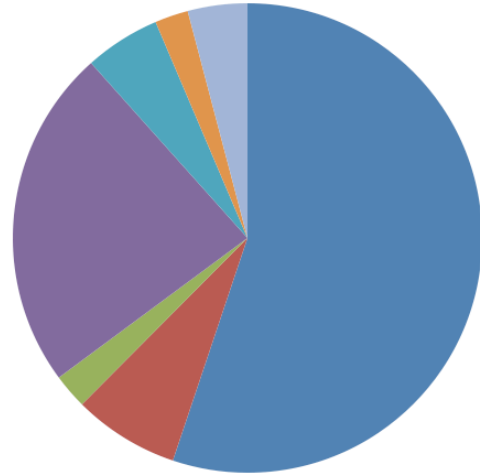
