

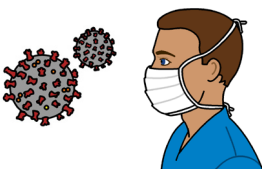
## I must wear a face mask - social story

I will wear a face mask when I go the shops, catch public transport or a taxi or go to hospital.



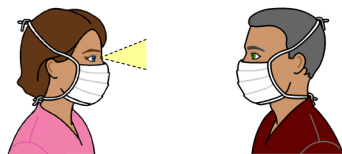
A face mask can help me and other people stay safe from Coronavirus.



My face mask must cover my nose, mouth and chin.



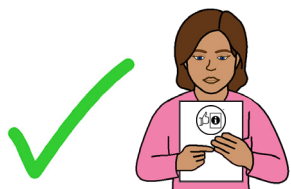
My face mask might feel uncomfortable at first.
